#### 4 Take candid shots

Take pictures of people behaving naturally for a documentary-style record of the event. Let people know beforehand that you will be taking pictures throughout the party.



### 5 Set your camera for low light

Use the lowest aperture number you have available in low light and set a reasonably high ISO. Choosing Auto Mode can set the exposure for you.



## 6 Try lengthening shutter speed

Adding motion blur can bring a feeling of energy. Try Shutter Priority mode and experiment with different speeds.
